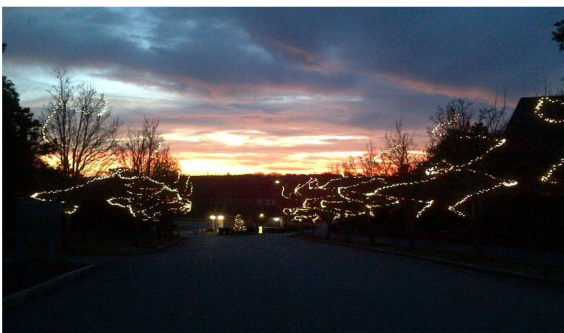

GOLF COURSE MAINTENANCE NEWS FROM LIANNE LARSON

As the end of the 2011 golf season rapidly approaches, the golf maintenance staff is already looking forward to the 2012 season. The good weather still continues with the temperatures reaching 64 recently. Our long range weather is predicting a change in the warm weather pattern real soon. Like all good things this too will come to and end!

We have begun the winterization of the golf course. The irrigation system has been blown out and closed down for the season. The winter course is cut in and cups have been set for when the weather changes. Once we convert over to the winter course maps/score cards will be available at the main office. The winter course usually opens for play around the second or third week in December.

The regular greens have been deep tine aerated to help with water infiltration during the winter months. Greens and tees have been heavily top-dressed and the snow mold fungicides will be applied shortly.

The dogs are ready for the arrival of the geese. The question is, are the geese ready for them?! Birdie **loves** her work and will hopefully have some geese to chase. The dogs will be on site Monday– Friday 6:00am to 4:00pm.

The wounded goose that has been here all season is still doing well but cannot fly. Golf Maintenance has been in contact with a sanctuary farm in the central part of MA. They have instructed us if we can catch the bird they will take it full time or they will take it for the winter and we can bring it back for the warm seasons. The task will be whether or not we can catch it. We have been instructed to start feeding it. Feeding it will get it more comfortable around people and hopefully we can catch it. We will do our best.

The golf course maintenance staff asks that when you see frosted turf that you please stay off the affected area. It is very important this time of year to use a tee on all tee boxes, replace all divots, and repair all ball marks. The damage done to the turf this time of the year does not recover until next May.

Iris g. Immortality

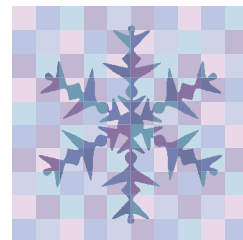
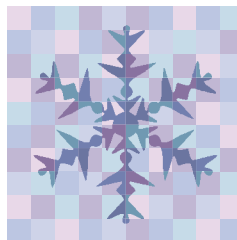
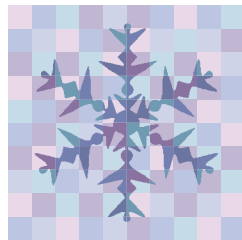
